THE START OF THE KENT AMBULANCE RETIREMENT ASSOCIATION by Barry Barnsley

During the latter part of 1992 I was at the previous Ashford Ambulance Station at Silver Hill Road with the then Chief Ambulance Officer Mike Robinson who was presenting Long Service/Good Conduct medals to a number of staff. After the presentations he was approached by Murray 'Badger' Swift and Bert Leadbetter, who asked him whether it was possible for a retirement association to be set up. Mr. Robinson subsequently asked me to investigate whether there was any interest in such an idea and if so, carry it forward.

I decided to visit the Personnel Department at Headquarters in Coxheath, Maidstone and, together with Val Page (Personnel Secretary), we identified the names and addresses of all members of staff who had retired either through ill health or age during the past 15 years. A questionnaire was then produced and circulated to all known retirees and whilst a number were not returned, I guess due to changes of address or circumstances, a significant number were returned with the vast majority in favour of the idea. KARA subsequently started in 1993 with John Hart as President and Bob Smith as Chairman. I attended the inaugural meeting in the Boardroom at Coxheath in 1993 when the Committee was elected and initially was asked if I'd be Chairman, but John Hart (HQ) pointed

out that as I was not retired this was not possible as the rules did not allow this. Basil Bourne (Lydd) became Treasurer for a significant number of years but I'm unsure if, as at this time, or shortly afterwards. I also recall Alan Vine (Folkestone) serving as an original member of the Committee.



New Book Finished 'Kent Ambulance & First Aid Services – An Illustrated History -

The book by Brian Janman covers the early years 1870 to the beginning of the National Health service and then continues through to the change from Kent Ambulance Service to the amalgamation into South East Coast Ambulance Service, combining Kent, East & West Sussex and Surrey Ambulance Services in 2006.

Brian Janman also published the following other books; Handcart to Hanlon – West Sussex Ambulance Services 1885-1995 published in 2013 & Sussex Ambulance & First Aid Services published in 2020.

He has spent some time researching and compiling, with the assistance of many; including Frank Stocks & Collin Varrall. All his research material has been gifted to KARA and the aim will be for this to be included in the electronic archive for the new website soon!

KARA Constitution & Extra Special Meeting 4th September

Constitution Changes

As members will recall, there has been great discussion around accepting currently serving members of SECAmb into the Association as members.

Your committee have discussed this at length and propose a change to the Constitution which is shown below. The proposed changes are shown in italicised red text.

Motion 1:

The objects of the Association to be for the purpose of mutual friendship and welfare also the promotion of social contacts between *serving* and retired members of the service

Motion 2:

Membership of the Association will be available to all *serving staff, and those* leaving *or having left* the service by reason of approaching or reaching retirement age, ill health or redundancy, or those entering into other employment within the NHS, who wish to maintain social contacts. *Membership is also open to those* leaving the Service for any other reason, subject to application to the committee for approval. However, a member of staff will NOT be granted membership if he/she has left the Service through reason of a disciplinary nature or having received a custodial sentence in a Court of Law.

Motion 3:

Subscriptions will be payable by members upon enrolment and thereafter on the 1st day of April, in succeeding years. The amount payable as subscription shall be decided at the Annual General Meeting of the Association. Any member or associate member who is 3 (three) months in arrears with his/her subscription will deemed to have cancelled his/her membership. Any member who reaches their ninetieth (90th) birthday is deemed to not be liable for membership fees and will not be required to pay for their membership as they shall be granted 'life membership'.

Motion 4:

Associate Membership (AMs) shall be available to spouses, partners, widows or widowers of Members. An annual subscription fee, payable on the 1st April will be in line with that of full Members. *The membership fee shall be waived for any widows or widowers*. AMs will be eligible to attend all KARA events including the AGM, however only full members may vote. They will receive the KARA Magazine and have access to our Web site.

We would urge members to register any concerns or contributions they have regarding this amendment by contacting the Secretary as soon as practically possible.
